### **Expectations**

#### Mission Statement

The mission of the Mansfield Evening School Program is to provide an educational experience in a small school environment staffed by a team of caring individuals who are committed to helping all students be successful and obtain a high school diploma. Classes are staffed with Certified Special Education Teachers.

### **Program of Studies**

Seniors enrolled in the day division may enroll for credit recovery. This is achieved by a contract initiated through the guidance department.

Students who have completed four years of high school but lack the necessary credits to graduate can present their transcripts for review. An education plan will be developed leading to graduation.

Students who transfer from the Day to Evening will have their educational record reviewed on an individual basis. Each student's plan to graduate will be set forth based on past success and the need to satisfy graduation requirements.

Student compliance and individual planning is paramount. A student transferring to Evening School must enroll full-time each semester until their class of record graduates.

Academic Units in English, Math, Science, Social Studies and Electives are offered each semester.

The number of units required in the discipline areas are determined based on past educational records and compliance.

English Unit requires 2 semesters.
